QUICKLY
 The Suns fell to the Thunder Saturday night, 121-109, as they trail 0-3 in the series ... With his 6th point of the night in Game 3 on 4/25, Devin Booker surpassed Steve Nash for 2nd on the Suns all-time playoff scoring list ... The Suns finished the 2025-26 regular season 45-37 following a 135-103 win over the Thunder Sunday night in Oklahoma City ... After losing their first Play-In game against POR, the Suns claimed the West's No. 8 seed Friday with a win over the Warriors ... Phoenix's 135 points in the regular season finale at OKC marked team season high ... 7 Suns players (not including rookies) averaged career highs in scoring this season in Brooks, O'Neale, Allen, Goodwin, Ighodaro, Gillespie and Bouyea ... Phoenix ranked 6th in the NBA this season in opponent points per game at 111.1, the fewest points a Suns team has allowed in a season since 2021-22 (107.3 ppg) With their 8th three-pointer of the night on April 8 against Dallas, the Suns set the single-season franchise record for team three-pointers ... 4 Suns players have made a game-winning basket in the final 7 seconds of regulation or OT this season (Royce O'Neale, Devin Booker, Collin Gillespie, Jalen Green) ... Making his 1,500th-career 3FG on 3/3 at SAC, Devin Booker joined Stephen Curry and Damian Lillard as the only players in NBA history to 17,000 career PTS & 1,500 3FG in 720 career games or less ... With his 2nd three-pointer of the night, Collin Gillespie set the Suns franchise record for three-point field goals in a season (227) on April 2 at Charlotte ... The Suns finished the regular season 18-0 when leading by 10+ points at halftime ... Oso Ighodaro played in all 82 regular season games in 2025-26, the first Suns player to do so since 2021-22 (Mikal Bridges) ... Collin Gillespie and Royce O'Neale became the first Suns duo to each make 200+ three-pointers in a single season in 2025-26 ... Devin Booker's 35-foot game winner with 0.7 seconds remaining vs. OKC on 1/4 was his 10th-career field goal to win or force OT in the final 3 seconds of regulation or OT, the 3rd-most in the NBA since he was drafted in 2015 ... The Suns averaged 9.5 steals per game this season, the 4th-most in the NBA this season and tied as the sixth-most in a season in franchise history (9.5 in 2000-01) ... The Suns joined this year's Warriors and Hawks as the only teams in the NBA this season with 1,200+ 3FG and 750+ STLs - it had only been done once prior to this season (2024-25 Warriors) ... With this 34th point on 3/31 at Orlando, Devin Booker reached 18,000 career points, becoming the 3rd-youngest shooting guard (29 years, 153 days) to 18K, trailing only Kobe Bryant and Michael Jordan.

PHOENIX – The Suns (0-3) fell to the Thunder (3-0) in Game 3 of the First Round of the NBA Playoffs following a 121-109 loss on Saturday night. Trailing by nine points (15-24) with 3:39 remaining in the first quarter, Oklahoma City closed the frame on an 18-4 run. The Thunder missed just one shot during the stretch, going 6-of-7 from the floor. Oklahoma City finished with 36 bench points to Phoenix's 12. **Grayson Allen** (7 points), **Royce O'Neale** (3 points) and **Khaman Maluach** (2 points) were the only Suns reserve to record points. The Thunder tallied 50 points in the paint to the Suns' 30. Oklahoma City shot over 61% (33-of-54 2FG) from two-point range. Phoenix shot 54.4% from two, attempting eight less two-pointers than the Thunder. **Dillon Brooks** recorded a playoff career-high 33 points (11-of-21 FG, 4-of-9 3FG) while tacking 7 rebounds. Brooks now has consecutive 30+ point playoff games for the first time in his career, becoming the ninth player in franchise history to do so. **Jalen Green** had 26 points, 6 assists and 1 steal. His 6 assists tied his career high in any postseason matchup. **Devin Booker** tallied 16 points and 7 assists. His first three-pointer of the night brought Booker to 1,367 points in his playoff career, passing Steve Nash for the second most points in franchise playoff history. **Oso Ighodaro** recorded 15 points (6-of-8 FG), 4 assists and 3 rebounds, while **Collin Gillespie** tallied a career-high 10 rebounds to go along with 7 points and 5 assists.

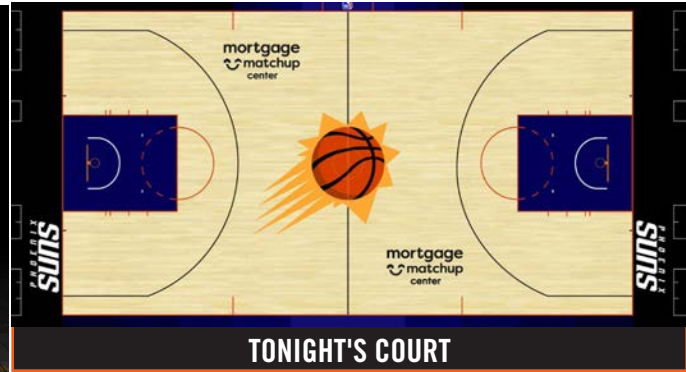

PHOENIX – The Suns (0-3) fell to the Thunder (3-0) in Game 3 of the First Round of the NBA Playoffs following a 121-109 loss on Saturday night. Trailing by nine points (15-24) with 3:39 remaining in the first quarter, Oklahoma City closed the frame on an 18-4 run. The Thunder missed just one shot during the stretch, going 6-of-7 from the floor. Oklahoma City finished with 36 bench points to Phoenix's 12. **Grayson Allen** (7 points), **Royce O'Neale** (3 points) and **Khaman Maluach** (2 points) were the only Suns reserve to record points. The Thunder tallied 50 points in the paint to the Suns' 30. Oklahoma City shot over 61% (33-of-54 2FG) from two-point range. Phoenix shot 54.4% from two, attempting eight less two-pointers than the Thunder. **Dillon Brooks** recorded a playoff career-high 33 points (11-of-21 FG, 4-of-9 3FG) while tacking 7 rebounds. Brooks now has consecutive 30+ point playoff games for the first time in his career, becoming the ninth player in franchise history to do so. **Jalen Green** had 26 points, 6 assists and 1 steal. His 6 assists tied his career high in any postseason matchup. **Devin Booker** tallied 16 points and 7 assists. His first three-pointer of the night brought Booker to 1,367 points in his playoff career, passing Steve Nash for the second most points in franchise playoff history. **Oso Ighodaro** recorded 15 points (6-of-8 FG), 4 assists and 3 rebounds, while **Collin Gillespie** tallied a career-high 10 rebounds to go along with 7 points and 5 assists.

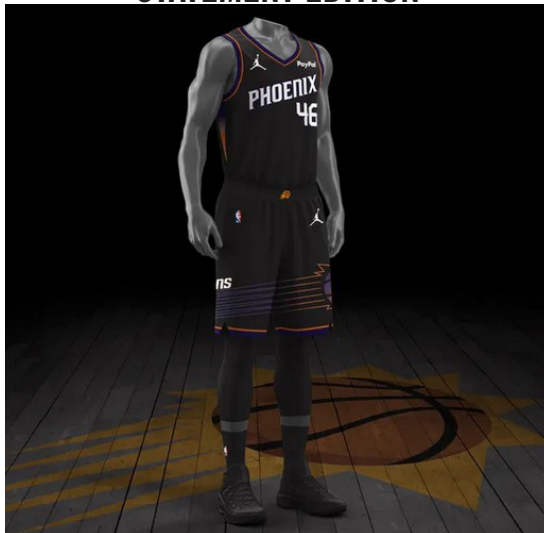

GAME 3 - APRIL 25 VS OKLAHOMA CITY

- + The Suns fell to the Thunder, 121-109, in Game 3 of the NBA Playoffs First Round
- + **DILLON BROOKS** recorded a playoff career-high 33 points (11-of-21 FG, 4-of-9 3FG) while tacking 7 rebounds Saturday night. Brooks now has consecutive 30+ point playoff games for the first time in his career, becoming the ninth player in franchise history to do so. He is the fourth player in Suns postseason history to tally 30+ points and 4+ triples in back-to-back games, joining Devin Booker, Chris Paul and Shawn Marion. Brooks now has scored in double figures in 10 straight games (regular season + Play-In Tournament + playoffs).
- + **JALEN GREEN** had 26 points, 6 assists and 1 steal in Game 3 against the Thunder. His 6 assists tie his career high in any postseason matchup. Green has now posted 17+ points in each of Phoenix's five Play-In Tournament and playoff games this season. He recorded 25+ points in three of the five contests. Green was the only Phoenix play to end the day with a positive +/- (+4).
- + **DEVIN BOOKER** tallied 16 points and 7 assists in Saturday's game. His first three-pointer of the night brought Booker to 1,367 points in his playoff career, passing Steve Nash for the second most points in franchise playoff history. He now has 114 3FGM in his playoff career, one shy of tying Dan Majerle for the most in Suns playoff history.
- + **OSO IGHODARO** recorded 15 points (6-of-8 FG), 4 assists and 3 rebounds in Game 3. It marked his first time ever posting double digit points in the NBA Playoffs. Ighodaro tied Booker and Green for the most minutes by any player today (39).
- + **COLLIN GILLESPIE** tallied a career-high 10 rebounds to go along with 7 points and 5 assists on Saturday. Gillespie joined Chris Paul and Devin Booker (four times) as the only Suns guards to reach 10+ rebounds in a postseason game since 2009-10.

GAME 2 - APRIL 22 AT OKLAHOMA CITY

- + The Suns fell to the Thunder, 120-107, in Game 2 of the NBA Playoffs First Round
- + **DILLON BROOKS** scored a team-high 30 points in Game 2 Wednesday night on 12-of-23 shooting (5-of-9 3FG). It marked the third-career 30+ point game of his in the NBA Playoffs, tying as the second-most he's scored in a postseason game. It also marked the third time of his postseason career he's made 5+ triples.
- + **DEVIN BOOKER** scored 22 points in Game 2, adding 7 rebounds and 4 assists. Booker remains 4 three-pointers away from surpassing Dan Majerle for the most three-pointers in the NBA Playoffs in franchise history and needs 6 more points to surpass Steve Nash for the 2nd-most points in franchise history in the NBA Playoffs.
- + **JALEN GREEN** tallied 21 points and 5 rebounds in Game 2, while **ROYCE O'NEALE** led all Suns reserves with 16 points, 9 rebounds, 4 assists and 2 steals in 34 minutes off the bench. He shot 4-of-5 from the field, all of which were from three-point range.
- + **COLLIN GILLESPIE** started in his first career postseason game in Game 2, tallying 7 points, 6 rebounds and 6 assists in 29 minutes of action.
- + **KHAMAN MALUACH** appeared in 19 minutes off the bench, tallying 4 points on 2-of-3 shooting and 3 rebounds. He finished with a team-high plus/minus of +10.

- + The Suns fell to the Thunder, 119-84, in Round 1 Game 1 of the NBA Playoffs
- + **DEVIN BOOKER** scored a team-high 23 points on 8-of-17 shooting (2-of-5 3FG) in Game 1, adding 6 rebounds and 2 assists. BACKCOURT SCORING STREAK

+ **DEVIN BOOKER** and **JALEN GREEN** became the fourth Suns duo in franchise history to each score 30+ points in consecutive games, doing so in Indianapolis on March 12 and Toronto on March 13. The two joined Walter Davis and Paul Westphal (twice - Dec. 13-15, 1979 and Dec. 29-30, 1977) and Alavan Adams and Walter Davis (Jan. 6-7, 1979). In the game at Indiana, the two combined to become the fifth set of Suns teammates to score 40+ points and 35+ points in a regular season or postseason game, as the last time it took place in a regular season game was on March 31, 2008 with Amare' Stoudemire (41 points) and Steve Nash (36) did it. Their combined 79 points at Indiana were the third-most by a guard duo in a single game in franchise history, trailing only 83 by Paul Westphal and Walter Davis (1/6/78 at BOS) and 81 by Booker and Leandro Barbosa (3/24/17 at BOS - Booker account for 70 of the points).

Jordan Ott, a veteran basketball coach with nearly two decades of experience, was named head coach of the Phoenix Suns on June 6, 2025, the 23rd head coach in franchise history.

In his first season as head coach with the Suns, Ott guided Phoenix to a 45-37 regular season record, the seventh best record in the Western Conference and the fourth-most wins by a rookie head coach in franchise history. The Suns boasted a top-10 defense in the NBA under Ott, ranking 4th in the NBA in steals per game (9.5), the Suns' best mark since the 1980-81 season (11.1). On the offensive end, seven Suns player averaged career highs in scoring, while the team averaged a franchise-best 14.7 three-pointers per game and 13.0 offensive rebounds per game, the highest mark by a Suns team since 2001-02. Ott was named Western Conference Coach of the Month for January after an 11-5 record, his first career honor.

Ott spent the 2024-25 season as an assistant coach with the Cleveland Cavaliers under NBA Coach of the Year Kenny Atkinson where he helped the team to a 64-18 record and the Eastern Conference's No. 1 seed. Cleveland led the league in Offensive Rating by scoring 121 points per 100 possessions, the second-highest rating in NBA history. Ott worked closely with Cavaliers forward Evan Mobley during his season in Cleveland, helping Mobley earn NBA Defensive Player of the Year honors and his first career All-NBA selection.

Throughout 12 seasons in the NBA, Ott's teams have earned 10 playoff berths and compiled a 517-447 (.536) record. Prior to Cleveland, Ott served two seasons as an assistant coach with the Los Angeles Lakers where he helped the team reach the Western Conference Finals in 2023. He was an assistant coach with the Brooklyn Nets for six seasons from 2016-22, helping the team reach the playoffs in each of his final four seasons in Brooklyn. Ott's first NBA position came with the Atlanta Hawks where he spent three seasons as a video coordinator from 2013-16 and was part of the Hawks team that won a franchise-record 60 games in the 2014-15 season.

Ott has also served as head coach at NBA Summer League on three occasions, doing so with Cleveland in 2024, Los Angeles in 2022 and Brooklyn in 2021.
